In 2012 ICES initiated a new Strategic Initiative on the Impacts of Climate Change on Marine Ecosystems (SICCME), in close cooperation with the North Pacific Marine Science Organization (PICES). The strategic initiative followed a number of ICES and PICES efforts to establish a strong and coordinated climate change research agenda across the North Atlantic and Pacific Oceans, and includes both coordination and implementation duties. This meeting, which followed similar discussions at previous Annual Science Conferences of ICES and PICES, intends to develop a community-led plan of action, including prioritization of the activities required to ensure a strong P/ICES footprint on climate change research.
