

Eyjafjallajökull Volcano Tour

Duration: 10 - 12 hours

Pick up: In Reykjavík from hotel or guesthouse at 08:00.

We provide: Driver-tour guide and a walk (3h).

You bring: warm clothing, rain gear, hiking shoes and lunch.

An exciting day tour that takes you to the area of the recent eruption that made headlines all over the world! On the way from Reykjavík to the Mt. Eyjafjallajökull glacier massif you will, depending on visibility, get a chance to observe the world famous volcano. Just further east, we turn onto a mountain track leading up the Fimmvörðuháls pass, where leaving our vehicles behind at 800m altitude, we gear up for an hour long hike up to the craters Magni and Móði (1100m).

These are the craters that erupted just before the principal crater of Eyjafjallajökull, and the fresh lava is still steaming and glowing under the surface. While exploring the craters and these new grounds you will get a sense of the forces of nature that were at work. From up here some breathtaking view over the Þórsmörk valley and the glaciers descending from the Mýrdalsjökull ice cap are also ours to enjoy.

On the way back a 4x4 drive down onto the black sand beaches will let you admire the beauty and power of the North Atlantic Ocean. Last but not least, the picturesque waterfalls Skógafoss and Seljalandsfoss are mandatory stops where the brave ones can venture behind the waterfall as it falls off its cliff!



Glacier Walk and Northern Lights

Duration: 11-12 Hours

Pick up: Pick up at Hotel or Guesthouse in Reykjavík at 11:30

We provide: Transport, guiding service, glacier gear, safety equipment and entrance Porvaldseyri Eruption Centre and traditional dinner (drinks and dessert not included).

You bring: Warm clothing, rain gear, hiking boots and lunch

Glacier Walk , Volcano Centre , Dinner and Aurora Adventure

The best combo tour available! On this amazing day tour you will be guided through the labyrinth of a glacier tongue, visit the Eyjafjallajökull Eruption centre and have a delicious lamb soup dinner at a farm before a Northern Lights hunt - all in the same day.

This tour combines two amazing winter highlights in Iceland: a Glacier Walk and a search for the amazing Aurora Borealis. On the drive towards **Mýrdalsjökull**, Iceland's fourth largest glacier, we pass two impressive waterfalls, **Seljalandsfoss and Skógarfoss** and of course the world famous volcano, **Eyjafjallajökull**. On **Sólheimajökull** a safe and easy Glacier Walk on crampons will take you up on to the ice field where you will discover the different ice features, water cauldrons, crevasses and waterways. After the glacier we stop at the Þorvaldseyri Eruption Centre run by the local family. It tells the story of the 2010 eruption from their point of view and its effect on the region. We then head to a local farm for a delicious traditional Icelandic Meat dinner. As we head back to Reykjavík, we will drive into the night looking out for those magical **Northern Lights**.

*Please note that the Northern Lights are a natural phenomenon and sightings, therefore, cannot be guaranteed.



Walk through Ice and Fire

Duration: 11 - 12 hours total, 4 - 5 hours hiking

Pick up: Hotel or Guesthouse in Reykjavík at 8:30

We provide: Transport, guiding services, ice gear and all necessary safety equipment.

You bring: Warm clothing, rain gear, hiking shoes, bathing suit and towel. Lunch can be bought on the tour.

This is a tour that combines two of Iceland's natural highlights, hot springs and glaciers.

A tour that combines two of Iceland's natural highlights, hot springs and glaciers, along with the notorious Eyjafjallajökull volcano! This day tour starts at Hengill geothermal area, located at the foot of an old volcanic cone. There you will take a 2 - 3 hour walk past a series of beautiful hot springs en route either to the Reykjadalur valley where you can enjoy a bath in a beautiful warm stream, or over the coldest winter months to the Grændalur valley, equally beautiful but without the bath.

The tour then continues by car right past the Eyjafjallajökull volcano towards the great Mýrdalsjökull glacier, one of the largest in Iceland. Driving through the region affected by the eruption and seeing how this outburst of nature's forces has changed the appearance of the landscape is a very unique experience. A glacier walk on the Sólheimajökull glacier tongue between ice sculptures, ridges and deep crevasses will complete your day. A tour that offers both magnificent nature and scenery.



Pearl Tour - Golden Circle Super Jeep/Truck Tour

Duration: 9-10 hours

Pick up: In Reykjavík from hotel or guesthouse at 08:30 – 9:00.

We provide: guided super truck tour, 1 hour snowmobile tour and all equipment needed, such as overalls, gloves, shoe covers and helmets.

You bring: warm, windproof clothing and good, sturdy shoes.

The Golden Circle tour allows visitors to get in touch with some of Iceland's most famous and exciting natural phenomena.

Our first stop is at Þingvellir National Park, which is one of Iceland's most significant historical sites because it was there that Iceland's first parliament was founded in the year 930 AD. From Þingvellir we head along mountain tracks toward the world-renowned geothermal area around Geysir hot spring, the one spouting hot spring on Earth after which all other spouting hot springs are named.

From there we continue on to Gullfoss ("the Golden waterfall") where your proximity to its edge is so close you can feel the spray of the glacial water on your face.

Next we kick the action into higher gear to get even closer to Iceland's nature and go for a snowmobiling tour on Langjökull, Iceland's second largest glacier.

We reserve the right to alter the itinerary according to weather and road conditions.

Please note:

Choices of roads and availability of activities are condition dependent.

For snowmobiling tours drivers need to present a valid driver's license. 2 persons share each snowmobile. Lunch and refreshments are not included in the prices and please note that operation period is dependent on snow layers.



Þórsmörk Glacier Valley

Duration: 9 - 11 hours.

Pick up: Participants are picked up at their accommodation at 8:30.

We provide: Driver/tour guide.

You bring: Warm clothing, rain gear and good shoes.

Thorsmork Glacier Valley is a natural oasis that lies just behind the now famous Eyjafjallajökull volcano. The recent eruptions have altered the appearance of the landscape but at the same time created a unique opportunity to witness how the elements of ice and fire constantly shape and reshape the surface of our planet. Only accessible by 4x4 vehicles, a tour into Thorsmork is truly an experience of nature.

Tuff landscape, Elf Church and River Crossings

Our destination is Þórsmörk, a natural paradise, named after the mighty pagan God Thor. To get into the land behind the glaciers we have to drive on a 4x4 track, over numerous unbridged glacial rivers some of which can be quite deep and with strong currents. On our way we will pass right by the Eyjafjallajökull volcano that recently erupted, blowing ash high into the sky and over the closest area. Even if in some places ash has altered the appearance of the landscape, Þórsmörk is always a magical place to visit. It is a valley, full of geological wonders and unique vistas that Icelandic nature lovers have enjoyed for centuries. On the way back spectacular Seljalandsfoss waterfall awaits us cascading down from the cliffs' edge in its unique way. This is a tour into a unique area recently touched by the powers of Mother Nature.
