I. Proceedings.

The Chairman opened the meeting and welcomed the various visitors and the members of the Sub-Committee.

The Sub-Committee had before them copies of a note, submitted to them by the Consultative Committee, from M. le Gall, "L'esprit des Annales Biologiques". No need appeared to be felt for any change in the present regulations governing the nature of the articles accepted for the Annales.

Advance copies of the Administrative Report and the Annales Biologiques for 1951 were available for the Sub-Committee, and both were submitted to the con= tributors for proof correction.
