The Status of I.C.E.S.

The Bureau has for some time examined the question of the status of the I.C.E.S. as compared to that of other international organisations, Several of these enjoy special privileges such as priority, faciliting rapid handling of mail, exemption for custom duties and exemption from income tax for their employees, and to the I.C.E.S. these privileges would be of considerable value.

However, it appears that the I.C.E.S. cannot at present be granted these privileges because the organisation does not have the required legal status. It is possible that this stumbling block may be removed if the member-states agree to sign a <u>convention</u>, thereby placing the co-operation between the adhering states on a firm basis.

The Bureau wishes to ask the Council for authority to examine this question further.
