Canada's Contributions to Administrative Reports

1. The purpose of the Administrative Reports has been to give a short, summarised survey of each member country's activities in the field of each area- and subject-committee, of which the country in question is a member.

The reports serve as basis for discussions in the committees as to co-ordination of the members further activities, and they also give the committees an opportunity to observe to which degree their scientific recommendations have been implemented in the member countries.

2. Most of the Canadian research takes place in areas where other ICES member countries do not operate, or where the co-ordination is taken care of during the ICNAF meetings.

3. There should be no need to duplicate reports to ICNAF and ICES. On the other hand, there may still be fields or subjects where Canadian reports would be useful for discussions in ICES' committees.

4. The Consultative Committee may wish to identify such fields or subjects, possibly after having had advice from all, or some, of the area- and subject-committees.
