

Marine Resources Management: an exercise in remote control?



Human dimensions?

We manage people, not ecosystems or resources!

- Process understanding: uses of marine ecosystems, their drivers, and responses to change
- **2. Evaluation**: identifying values, assessing and communicating tradeoffs, including ecological, economic and social dimensions
- Governance arrangements: including the role of research in collective decision-making



Symposium themes

- **1. Identifying needs for managing multiple ocean use sectors:** What information is needed to inform policy, management and industry developments?
- **2. Coupled ecological, economic and social process understanding:** Can we build scenarios integrating ecological, economic and social dimensions?
- **3. From data to indicators to reference points and performance evaluation:** How do we use available data to set reference points and assess policy performance?
- **4. Participatory assessment processes:** What are the opportunities and challenges associated with participatory research?
- **5. Governance and institutional frameworks:** Can governance systems promote greater integration of knowledge systems and ocean management?
- **6. Case studies:** What lessons have we learned from practical research experience?





Symposium goals


- Advancing our understanding of marine social-ecological systems
